From the Minister's study—

Closure of Bournville URC

On the 9th of July about 60 members and friends of Bournville URC, from the Cadbury pastorate and from neighbouring churches, who were associated with the church in times past and present, gathered in Bournville United Reformed Church to celebrate for one last time its Anniversary and to officially close the church. The church, formerly Churches of Christ, was formed in 1906 and moved into the Beaumont Rd church building in 1914. In the service of thanksgiving and closure we gave thanks for the many years of faithful ministry and fellowship in the church building and for the outreach in the community. We remembered the many people, young and old, who were part of the congregation, who supported the church in its ministry and outreach and who met in the church building for activities (eg the Pilots). It was a joyful service, wonderful and life-transforming memories were shared and encouraging words were spoken by the Synod Moderator, Steve Faber. The church was beautifully decorated with banners, woodcarvings, artwork, puppets, and other symbols that reminded us of the lively, loving and talented congregation that has met in the Beaumont Rd church building over the years. We also expressed the hope

that the church building will continue to be a place of worship and outreach as the Fellowship of the Churches of Christ have taken on a lease for its use. The Bournville URC members, now ready to move on to new places, new adventures, joined by all who were gathered to support them, were sent out with the following words:

God remains with us Though we let go of our cherished place God remains with us Though we will sing new songs and worship in new ways God remains with us Though we serve in different ways and pursue different causes God remains with us God's love remains with us

And so be it!

After singing "You shall go out with joy" in crescendo, coffee/tea and cakes were served and many more memories were shared among us.

<u>Who's it for</u>?

Those who normally come to Synod but also anyone who is interested - this is an open event to come and gain from the resources and the friendship and encouragement on offer.

The venue needs an early indication of numbers - so to help you in estimating them here's some information about finance.

- 1. First the bad news. The inclusive cost of bed, breakfast, dinner on the Friday evening, lunch on the Saturday, coffee and tea breaks, room hire etc, etc is £155 in a single room and £220.00 for a double or twin room.
- 2. The better news is that the Synod expects to pick up the cost of a good bit of this, maybe up to half as well as paying all travel as usual.
- 3. However, we would be grateful (and will separately ask Church Treasurers about this) if churches could consider paying at least £75 towards the cost of each person attending and staying overnight.
- 4. Individuals, who feel willing and able to contribute, can pay whatever they wish towards the cost too.
- 5. For those coming on the Saturday only, the cost to Synod is $\pounds 45$ (inclusive of lunch) and we are asking for a minimum contribution of $\pounds 25$ towards this.

- 6. But please don't be put off by the cost if there's a problem, talk to us on 0121 783 1177.
- 7. Parking is available, but we would encourage you to use public transport where possible. There is a free Shuttle Bus Service between Birmingham International Train Station and the hotel.

As indicated above we need your help to gauge numbers attending so please consider this invitation and let us know the names of people from your church including your Synod representative and Minister, who will be coming. Please let us know by 26th July 2023 and tell us who wants overnight accommodation and who will be a day visitor on the Saturday only. Please fill in the booking form with the details. Ann has copies of this.

It would also help us if payment could be sent in advance wherever possible with a note of what and who is being paid for. Please send payment to the Synod Office for the attention of Lindsay Peniston.

We have had as many as 230 people at previous events on the Saturday who seem to have got a great deal from the occasion. Ann has the draft programme leaflet which gives a brief glimpse into the event and the choice of Mission streams (workshops).



Anna Chaplaincy

Prompted by Rev. Barbara Calvert, Chris Miles has been training for the 'Anna Chaplaincy'. This is what it is all about: Anna

Chaplains are named after the widow, Anna, who appears with Simeon in Luke's gospel; both are good role models of faithful *older* people.

Anna Chaplains are there for people of strong, little or no faith at all and seek



to accompany older people at this age and stage of their lives. This is an ecumenical, community-based, chaplaincy promoting the spiritual welfare of older people, and is a person-centred and non-judgemental ministry. Anna Chaplains try to help people to reflect on their life's journey—both the joys and the sorrowsand, where appropriate, enable the healing of memories and the celebration of life experiences to foster more hope and resilience.

This involves visiting older people wherever they may be living, whether in residential and nursing homes, sheltered housing, retirement complexes or private homes. The emphasis is on spiritual support but, clearly, people's practical struggles will also play a part in their overall well-being. An Anna Chaplain also has a wider role within the community as an advocate and a champion of the contribution older people make to society. They may enable cross-generational encounters in the Church and wider community for the benefit of people of all ages.

The Anna Chaplaincy Prayer:

Faithful God, you have promised in Christ to be with us to the end of time.

Come close to those who have lived long and experienced much. Help them to continue to be faithful and, within the all-age kingdom of God,

to find ways to go on giving and receiving your grace, day by day. For your glory and your kingdom. **Amen**
